Greetings to all members, family and friends of Lake Holiday!

AMENITY PASS – When you are out fishing at a green area, cruising in your boat or laying out on the beach, you WILL be asked to produce your 2011 Lake Holiday amenity pass. You will also be asked to show a photo ID to show that the name on your LH pass matches your true identity. If you are fishing, you will be asked to produce a valid Illinois fishing license. The Private Security staff intends to continue strict pass checks at every green area and beach. The Marine Patrol will also ask you for your pass, a photo ID and they will ask you to show them your 2011 LH watercraft registration sticker.

Please note: LH 2011 Vehicle Stickers do not “validate” membership when an amenity is being used. A few of the residents we have checked recently point to their vehicles and say, “I have the sticker on my car. Isn’t that proof to show that I live here?” Please understand that my staff does not know you personally. Your vehicle sticker identifies the vehicle registered to your lot – it does not identify YOU or the guests you have with you. This is why pass checks frequently involve photo ID checks. This enforcement process ensures that only you, your claimed guests and all the other members of Lake Holiday are allowed to use private amenities. We are providing a service to keep your property private.

LITTER ON THE LAKE – Last year we have had many complaints of litter on the lake. Most of the litter described ranges from aluminum cans to Styrofoam bait canisters. Please do not throw any litter on the lake. The fine for this offense is \$200.00.

CURFEW – I was notified by a few parents that had questions about juvenile curfew hours in Lake Holiday:

All persons under the age of 18 are not allowed to be out after 11pm – Sunday-Thursday and 12am on Fridays & Saturdays.

Any subjects under the age of 18 will receive a Lake Holiday citation for \$100.00 and may also receive a State citation and fine from the LaSalle County Sheriffs Department.
